AN UNCHANGING GOD IN A CHANGEABLE WORLD

Rev Rob Anning, Superintendent Minister, writes:

The recent summery weather has brought out all our thinner and lighter clothing to keep us cool in the sunshine. Some of the sights around the town centre of Banbury have been “sights for sore eyes”, and some have been “sights to make your eyes sore”!

Many have been wearing the latest fashions, dispensing with last year’s garments and replacing them with those that are in vogue. When summer is over, we will change our fashions again; some returning to clothing kept in the wardrobe ready for more chilly days, whilst others will buy the latest fashions for the winter. It is a choice of “old faithfuls” or the new, fashionable designs. Either way, we will change as the world changes.

We live in a fashion-conscious world. Much that surrounds us is transient. To a large extent, our economy depends on changing things before they are worn out. The charity shops of Banbury are awash with cast-offs with plenty of life still left in them. Others may benefit from this but the underlying message is one of change.

Our Banbury Methodist Circuit is not immune from change (*see a further article about Circuit changes*). We don’t change for fashions sake but out of a desire to be more able to worship God and share our faith in the present age. Few of us like change, but inevitably change is necessary.

In a world of change, it is good to have something that is permanent. The writers of the Psalms describe God as “a refuge and strength”, “a rock and fortress” and “though the earth should change and the mountains shake” there is nothing to fear.

Joseph Hart captures that nature of God in his hymn, when he writes:

*This, this is the God we adore,
Our faithful, unchangeable friend,
Whose love is as great as his power,
And neither knows measure nor end.*

So we hold on to the fact that God is unchanging in a changing world and we can depend on him.

CHANGES WITHIN THE BANBURY METHODIST CIRCUIT

The next few months will bring significant changes to the way the Banbury Methodist Circuit works. Rev Dorothy Hewitson will be on sabbatical for the months of June, July and August. During that time, all of the churches in Dorothy's pastoral care (Cropredy, Easington, Bodicote, Adderbury, Wroxton and Hornton), should contact myself or Rev Janet Jackson if there is a pastoral situation to which you want us to respond. Any other questions, doubts or concerns should also be directed to either of us.

Dorothy's sabbatical is well deserved, the first in her ministry, and we should respect her privacy during those three months. In the end, Dorothy will return refreshed; she will also have had the chance to do some study. All this means that when she returns, we will all benefit from her three-month break without interruption.

Methodism has some quaint ways! At the recent Ministerial Synod, Dorothy asked for permission to "sit down". In layman's terms, that's a request to retire. Permission was granted. But we are glad that Dorothy has decided to remain in the Banbury Circuit for at least the next three years, working half time. This means she becomes an "active supernumerary". In order to reduce Dorothy's workload to a manageable size for the three days a week that she will be working, from September 1, her pastoral charge will be of the three churches Easington, Adderbury and Bodicote. Dorothy will be working most Sundays plus two other days. With time, Dorothy's new section will discover how those additional two days will be communicated to everyone. But in the meantime, please be patient with this new way of working. It will take us a while to get used to a half-time minister.

All of this means that the workload of Rev Janet Jackson and myself will be increasing from September. Janet will be taking on pastoral care of Wroxton and Hornton, to add to her present chapels of The Fairway, Middleton Cheney, Chacombe, Greatworth, Hinton and Upper Boddington. Eight chapels is a lot to care for, so again, can I ask for everyone to be patient as Janet comes to terms with working out her new section. I will be taking on Cropredy, to add to Marlborough Road, Grimsbury and Neithrop.

Over the next few months, you will begin to see adverts for our new Rural Church and Community Co-ordinator which we hope will begin work in September. The new worker will be working with the chapels at Greatworth, Chacombe, Upper Boddington and Adderbury, to help those chapels to make connections with their communities and begin to share faith more effectively.
